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Visit to a Fire Station

Grade: 1

You are never too young to learn. Children of grade 1 were taken on a short and informative field trip to nearby fire station, in order to extend the knowledge on Neighbourhood places. They got a hands-on-experience on fire safety by watching how fire fighters use their fire truck in an emergency. The fire fighters showed them the different equipment used by them and demonstrated the use of a fire extinguisher and discharge hose. Our children were briefed by the fire officer on how to contact the fire authorities in case of an emergency by dialing 101, and introduced the international emergency contact by dialing 112. Lastly, students were made to visit the vehicles, firemen used during the state of emergency.
